

The NADFAS Record of Church Furnishings 2015 by the Bath Group commenced in 1997




The church lies on the hill above the hamlet of Burton and dates from c 1290, although little remains from that period. The external walls of the nave and aisle date from the 14th C and in 1460 a general re-modelling of the church took place which included re-roofing the church, the building of the chancel and the erection of the north and south porches. The tower is 15th C and holds a ring of 6 bells in a bellchamber restored in 1982.

The north aisle is filled with Georgian box pews. There is, below the roof and on the arches, a fine array of corbels and carved figures, mostly carved human faces with a few grotesques. The Royal Arms over the chancel arch is in the form used by the Georges until 1801 which were the last of the Royal Arms to display the Arms of France in the 2nd quarter.

The stone pulpit has 15th C carving and the stone steps up to it are 600 years old. Beside the altar there is a heraldic wall monument with marks of lightning on it.

A two manual pipe organ with pedal board. Each manual gives four octaves. The stops, labelled in black roman caps are arranged vertically on either side of the manuals: Left: Horn 8; (indecipherable) horn 4; lieblich cedat 8; horn diapason 8; blank; swell to great; swell to pedal; great to pedal. Right: flute; principal; clarabella 8; dulciana 8; opendiapason 8; bourdon 16. Five metal pedal and 29 wooden ones giving three and a half octaves.

A twenty three metal pipe display at the front is arranged in three peaks with thirteen pipes in the centre and five on each side. There are eleven metal pipes on left side of the case and 5 on the right. Also 6 metal pipes on the left and fifteen square wooden ones at the back.

The front pipes are retained by a bar, decorated with a pierced leaf design and billets, supported by four slender turned columns. The lower half is panelled with stained deal.

There is an electric blower on the left side and a hand blower on the right.

A shaded strip electric light is mounted above the manuals and a small rectangular mirror on the leftside. On the front of the case are three plaques:


